3	Access to site. Limited access to Clubhouse	Yellow	Site	<p>Social distancing to be maintained at all times. Minimum 1m apart outside and minimum of 2m apart inside (unless within household unit). If this cannot be maintained then please leave site.</p> <p>Social gatherings on site should follow Government guidance of up to 6 people from different households outside or groups of 2 households.</p> <p>Minimum of 1m Distancing to be observed on the slipway and pontoon with priority for those coming off the water / ashore</p> <p>Boats can be delivered and removed from site.</p> <p>All children under 12 must be supervised at all times.</p> <p>All rubbish must be taken home.</p> <p>Club hand mowers will be available for use by members to maintain their boat park spot. Sanitizing equipment will be kept alongside for members to clean all touch points before & after use.</p>
	Independent recreational sailing, including canoes and SUP		Clubhouse	<p>Access for toilet facilities only. Limited to one person (or more than one if of the same household unit) in each of the male & female WCs at any one time – no showers or changing.</p> <p>Door to toilets within clubhouse should be closed when toilets in use and opened again when leaving to indicate available. (if in doubt call into toilets from the clubhouse)</p> <p>If someone is already waiting in the Clubhouse to use the toilet other people should wait a minimum of 2m apart.</p> <p>Cleaning spray to be used on all surfaces touched and wiped with a paper towel.</p> <p>Thorough hand washing is a must following signs by the sinks. Use of hand sanitizer on entering and exit of the building.</p>

Canoes & SUP	<p>Cruisers may be put on their moorings and used following Canal & River trust guidance.</p> <p>Independent single handed and multi handed dinghy sailing within family unit is allowed.</p> <p>Multi handed dinghy and cruiser from different households is allowed following RYA guidance https://www.rya.org.uk/SiteCollectionDocuments/clubs/RYA%20Sailing%20%26%20Racing%20in%20Mixed%20Households.pdf</p> <p>Recommend to arrange buddy sailing if you would otherwise be on your own.</p> <p>Minimum of 1m distancing to be observed on the slipway and when launching and landing. Do not land on slipway if another boat is being recovered or launched. Priority is given for boats landing.</p> <p>Sailors must be competent and able to deal with the weather and river conditions without assistance. Including launching and recovery of boat.</p> <p>Sailors should either arrive and leave in their sailing kit or change discretely in the car park.</p> <p>There is no safety boat cover. However in an emergency, or to recover a stranded boat a safety boat can be launched at members own discretion and risk.</p> <p>Club Visions & Lasers can be borrowed on a Sunday only and will be allocated by the OOD on a 'first come first served' basis to a single user(s) for the whole day. These boats are only to be used on a Sunday to allow for self-sanitizing during the week.</p>
	Limited Assisted sailing		Organised racing	<p>Organised racing is supported by a dedicated risk assessment and instructions. This plan contains a summary.</p> <p>A Maximum of 20 boats per race.</p> <p>Single handed and multi handed dinghy sailing within family unit is allowed.</p> <p>Multi handed dinghy sailing from different households is allowed following RYA guidance https://www.rya.org.uk/SiteCollectionDocuments/clubs/RYA%20Sailing%20%26%20Racing%20in%20Mixed%20Households.pdf</p> <p>Participants should spread out in the rigging areas to maintain 2m separation.</p> <p>Race officers and Safety Boat crew are not included in the maximum of 20 boats.</p> <p>Racing will be weather and river condition dependant to minimise the likelihood of assistance being required on the water. The OOD decision will be final.</p> <p>Single handed safety boat operation (with risk mitigations identified and where conditions allow) or 2 from same household is the preference . Different household crewing can take place with crew maintaining 2m separation. Face coverings (stored on the boat) must be worn if a person is recovered into the safety boat.</p> <p>All boats must have a painter of at least 5m to allow for single handed recovery and towing at a distance.</p> <p>Club Visions & Lasers can be borrowed and will be allocated by the OOD on a 'first come first served' basis to a single crew for the whole day. These boats are only to be used on a Sunday to allow for 'self-sanitizing' during the week.</p>
	Limited organised camping		Training / Assisted Sailing	<p>Organised Assisted Sailing is supported by a dedicated risk assessment and instructions. This plan contains a summary.</p> <p>A Maximum of 20 boats per session.</p> <p>Participants should spread out in the rigging areas to maintain 2m separation.</p> <p>Event organiser and Safety Boat crew are not included in the maximum of 20 boats.</p> <p>sailing will be weather and river condition dependant to minimise the likelihood of assistance being required on the water. The event organisers decision will be final.</p> <p>Single handed safety boat operation (with risk mitigations identified and where conditions allow) or 2 from same household is the preference . Different household crewing can take place with crew maintaining 2m separation. Face coverings (stored on the boat) must be worn if a person is recovered into the safety boat.</p> <p>All boats must have a painter of at least 5m to allow for single handed recovery and towing at a distance.</p> <p>Club single handed boats can be used. To be allocated by event organiser and used by a single person in any one day. Boats will be stored for a week before reuse to 'self-sanitize'</p>
	No Visitors		Camping	<p>Those with annual caravan spaces may use the site for storage if required.</p> <p>Camping is open from 17/8/20 with restricted numbers and pre-booking. Camping will be supported by dedicated risk assessment and instructions including enhanced cleaning for facilities.</p>
			Galley & Bar	<p>Bring own food and drink and take home rubbish</p> <p>Bar will be open for takeaway service to be consumed outside the clubhouse. The bar will be staffed. No self service (See separate Bar risk assessment for full details)</p>
