



Avon Sailing Club Boat Park Management and Waiting List Policy

1. The following registered boats and small craft (see Rule 9 **Registered Boats**) are those able to use the boat park for storage:
 - a. Sailing dinghies
 - b. Kayaks and Canoes
 - c. Small Rowing boats
 - d. Sailing cruisers

for which a “boat fee” is payable which also permits storage in the boat park subject to availability. The Club will notify members at the time of annual subscription requests of the fee payable for each boat or small craft type and the fee relating to the number of boats/small craft owned by the member.

2. Inflatable paddle boards are deemed portable and as such no facility is available for their storage on the club site.
3. No reduction in fee is given for members choosing not to utilise a space in the boat park for whatever reason.
4. In addition to any Club membership fees and boat fees, all registered boats and small craft are required to have a Canal and River Trust (CRT) licence. For those paying a boat fee other than for a Cruiser, this is offered at a reduced price per craft under a scheme agreed with the Canal and River Trust.
5. Cruisers are required to hold their own individual CRT licence and this must be purchased directly through the Trust. The Club is not permitted to provide this as part of the CRT fee through the club membership scheme.
6. Any approved craft propelled by a motor (including electric motors) are required to have their own individual CRT licence even if being used at the club for a short period as the Club is not permitted to provide this as part of the licence fee through the club membership.
7. Motor boats (including RIBS and any small craft that may use an outboard) are not permitted to use the boat park unless given prior permission by the Committee for a special purpose, i.e. safety boat use at Avon week.
8. The provision of a boat space is provided at the absolute discretion of the Committee.
9. A space in the boat park will be allocated with Ordinary or Junior memberships. Affiliated Club boats will be allocated space for a maximum of six boats (ASC Rule 67).

10. No fee reduction will be made for time a registered boat is away from an allocated boat park space
11. Every effort will be made to ensure that all eligible members are allocated a space(s) subject to availability.
12. Members must register all boats as part of their membership to enable the requisite fee to be applied. Members will receive a label that must be attached to the registered boat or small craft and clearly visible at all times. Any registered boat that fails or whose owner fails to satisfy appropriate conditions may be excluded from the club (ASC Rule 9).
13. Spaces are numbered in the dinghy park, along the back of the grounds furthest from the club house and in the canoe rack. A diagram of these areas can be found on the members area of the ASC website.
14. The member will hold the right to their allocated boat space until such time as they:
 - no longer require it
 - resign their membership
 - is asked to leave (only being invoked in line with sailing club rules and policies)
 - are in arrears with their subscriptions
15. Spaces are strictly non-transferable. If you no longer require your space, you must inform the Membership Secretary prior to 31st January for the current year. No refund will be provided. See 3. Above.
16. Members must ensure they have the minimum of third-party boat insurance cover for at least £3,000,000.
17. Members with a boat space must ensure that they keep their space regularly maintained.
18. Members must ensure that road trailers and boat trolleys are maintained and capable of being moved at all times.
